ACCESS TO OUR RECORDS

Latest notice regarding categories of records

A Section 52 notice is not invoked by Bonethrower.com and information required, apart from material already in the public domain (such as sales and product brochures), must follow the request procedure.

Records that are available / may be requested

Administration

- Relevant agreements, such as leases

Operations

Bonethrower.com is a private company conducting business in counselling and esoteric matters and has records pertaining to these operations

Client records

To the extent that our client base forms an integral part of Bonethrower.com's capital, the supply of information pertaining to it must be considered upon each request

Finances

- Financial statements



THE PROCEDURE TO REQUEST OUR RECORDS

The requester must use the prescribed form to request access to a record. The prescribed form (Form C for private bodies) is available from the SAHRC.

- The request must be made to our proprietor

The requester must provide sufficient detail on the request form to enable Bonethrower.com to identify both the record and the requester.

- The requester must indicate which form of access is required
- A postal address or fax number is required
- We are obliged to respond within 30 days

The requester must identify the right that is sought to be exercised or protected, and provide explanation as to why the requested record is required for the exercise of that right.

- Bonethrower.com will act with all due diligence in the matter of information transparency but at the same time honouring due processes.

If the request is made on behalf of another person, the requester must submit proof of the capacity in which the requester is making the request, to the satisfaction of our head of organisation

Bonethrower.com will notify you of its decision once it has been made. Please note that there are instances in which Bonethrower.com may refuse to grant you access to the record, in terms of the Act.

If Bonethrower.com does grant your request, you will be charged an additional fee for the access (per page provided to you).

FEES PAYABLE FOR REQUESTING OUR RECORDS

A requester who seeks access to a record containing personal information about that requester is not required to pay the request fee.



Every other requester, who is not a personal requester, must pay the required fee.

- The head of the organisation will notify the requester that the prescribed fee is payable before the request is processed further
- The requester must pay a fee as stipulated in the Act guide, currently R50.00
- The requester may lodge an application in court against the tender or payment of the request fee
- Once the head of organisation has made a decision on the request, the requester will be notified in the required manner
- If the request is granted, a further access fee must be paid for the search and reproduction involved
- Current fees regulated are: photocopy R1.10; printed copy R0.75; stiffer disk R7.50; compact disc R70.00; time R15.00 per hour (excluding the first hour) with a 33% deposit payable for time exceeding six hours; postage at actual costs
